



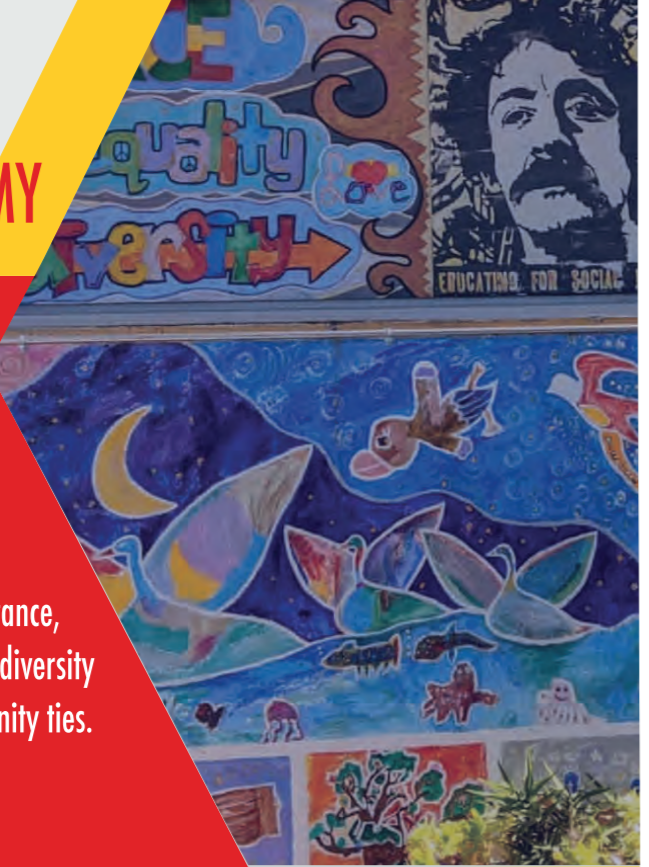
WELCOME TO HARVEY MILK CIVIL RIGHTS ACADEMY
